ORDER:

Government of Andhra Pradesh cherishes the vision of establishing a Simple, Moral, Accountable, Responsive and Transparent Government 'SMART' Government. e-Government is use of IT, in particular Internet, to deliver public services in a convenient, customer-oriented, cost-effective and altogether different and better way. e-Government is identified as one of the vehicles that can be deployed gainfully in attaining the goals of SMART governance. Government of Andhra Pradesh, which has adopted Information Technology as the tool for the over all development of the state has already been making pioneering efforts in implementing e-Governance projects towards ensuring better governance. Government of India has also recognized the concerted efforts of the state Government in the direction of promoting e-Governance initiatives. As of now the State Government embarked on implementing e-Seva, SmartGov, Performance tracking system, Land Records Management Information System (LRMIS), Rural Service Delivery Points (RSDP), Multi Purpose Household Survey (MPHS), Online Transaction Processing (OLTP) System, Computerized Administration of Registration Department (CARD), Citizen Friendly System of Transport (CFST), APNET, AP Portal, etc. Other e-Governance projects in the pipeline are e-Procurement, Integrated Financial Information System (IFIS), Human Resource Management System (HRMS), Social Benefit Management System (SBMS) etc. Certain programmes viz., e-Seva, OLTP, RSDP, LRMIS etc. are to be pursued vigorously and implemented on a time bound basis at the district level in order to expedite the benefits reaching the common man.

2. In order to ensure the desired focus on the implementation of various e-governance projects at the grass root level the felt need for the official involvement was very well recognized and the Government recently appointed District Information Officers (DIOs) to help in implementing the e-Governance initiatives at the district level. During the deliberations in the Collectors Conference it was identified that there is immediate need to involve the district administration in the roll out of e-Seva to districts and in effective implementation of other e-Governance projects at the district level with the help of the DIOs already positioned. In the Collectors Conference, it was decided that the Joint Collectors at the district level should be made in charge of the various e-Governance initiatives at the district level.

3. Government after careful consideration hereby order that the Joint Collectors shall be in charge of e-Governance initiatives at the District-level. The Joint Collectors shall be responsible for ensuring that the benefits of e-Government initiatives reach the common man. They will work in close coordination with the Information Technology & Communications Department

and other Secretariat Departments concerned with the implementation of the ongoing e-Governance projects as well as new projects that may be taken up from time to time.

4. Their immediate attention shall be focused on the following:
 - a. Establishing and operationalizing every identified e-Seva Centre in all the Municipalities in the District in close coordination with all concerned.
 - b. Establishing –
 1. District Knowledge Centres
 2. District portals on AP Online on the lines of a generic model being developed.
 3. Rural Service Delivery Points (RSDP) and
 - c. Over seeing and helping in effective implementation of –
 1. Multi Purpose Household Survey (MPHS) Database- Coverage of all Mandals
 2. Land Records Management Information System (LRMIS)
 3. Online Transaction Processing (OLTP) System
 4. APNET Ku-Band Project
 5. Performance Tracking System
 - d. Review and reporting of the progress, performance and bottlenecks involved in carrying out various projects.
5. The District Information Officers will report to Joint Collectors for administrative purposes and the State Chief Information Officer for technical purposes.
6. The above responsibilities shall be in addition to the present duties and responsibilities assigned to the Joint Collectors by the competent authority.
